The Volusia-Flagler Dental Association Executive Committee met at Bill France Room, Daytona 500 Experience, September 2, 2009, 6:00 pm

- Treasurer's report: Dr. Olson recommended that speaker's budget be increased
 to \$4000 annually to allow greater flexibility in presenting quality programs and to
 reflect realistic anticipated expense based on previous years. Various strategies to
 balance our budget were discussed including raising tuition fee for biennial required
 courses and increasing our membership ranks.
- New Member Recruitment: New Dentist Mixer was judged to be a limited yet tangible success. Consideration was given to holding a similar event in Palm Coast. Flagler County dentists appear to be under-represented in VFCDA. Dr. Olson agreed to promote membership at local study clubs in Palm Coast. It was agreed to invite potential members to the annual installation banquet.
- Local hygienists Catherine Stark and Beth Thompson have been circulating information to dental offices and soliciting referrals for their Orofacial Myology practice in Port Orange. Some concerns were expressed about the legitimacy of this practice considering the unconventional claims made in promotional material and the lack of any formal association with a licensed dentist. The consensus of the Executive Committee is to not associate the VFCDA with this practice nor provide a forum for promoting its services.
- Dr. Flutie discussed her initiative to utilize the VFCDA to promote and facilitate volunteer dental service in our community. Volunteer opportunities will be placed on our website to recruit providers and solicit donations of supplies and equipment. Information for the public will also be publicized to provide information and access for those looking for help. Dr. Flutie presented request for \$3000 annual donation be provided by VFCDA to Good Samaritan Dental Clinic in Orange City. Motion to accept proposal made by Dr. Kenzik. Seconded by Dr. Larkin.

Health Department Offers Low/No Cost Dental Care

The Volusia County Health Department has a fully operational dental clinic located at 1845 Holsonback Drive, Daytona Beach. The clinic primarily serves children with Medicaid and provides comprehensive preventive and restorative care. The clinic also provides emergency "relief of pain" care to adults with Medicaid. Emergency treatment is also provided to any school age child who does not have a "dental home". Payment for non-covered services is based on a sliding scale for income level. FDA Members' Help Needed to Ensure Florida Dentists Receive Insurance Payments

Dear FDA-member dentist:

Recently, preferred provider organizations (PPOs) may have refused to pay Florida dentists directly, even when requested by the patient. This may be occurring even though the Florida Dental Association (FDA) successfully passed 2009 legislation to allow PPO patients to assign payment to out-of-network providers. Your help is needed in order to ensure Florida dentists receive payments!

Starting July 1, if your patient has assigned payment of insurance benefits to you and the PPO has denied payment in writing, please consider filing a complaint with the Florida Department of Financial Services (DFS). At least 100 dentists need to file an official complaint in order for any kind of action to occur against the insurance companies.

Insurance companies, by law, are required to comply with patients' requests. However, some companies claim the new law does not apply to them. The FDA is working closely with the Florida Office of Insurance Regulation to clarify how the new law will be implemented and which insurance companies must comply. Your action is urgently needed.



Specifically, the new law states:

627.638 Direct payment for hospital, medical services. —

(2) Whenever, in any health insurance claim form, an insured specifically authorizes payment of benefits directly to any recognized hospital, licensed ambulance provider, physician, dentist, or other person who provided the services in accordance with the provisions of the policy, the insurer shall make such payment to the designated provider of such services. The insurance contract may not prohibit, and claims forms must provide an option for, the payment of benefits directly to a licensed hospital, licensed ambulance provider, physician, dentist, or other person who provided the services in accordance with the provisions of the policy for care provided The insurer may require written attestation of assignment of benefits. Payment to the provider from the insurer may not be more than the amount that the insurer would otherwise have paid without the assignment.

So what does this mean to you, the practicing dentist? A patient with a PPO type of insurance plan can now seek care from a dentist outside the plan's network and assign the payment benefits to that dentist. The insurance company must pay the amount of the plan's schedule to that dentist for the particular service rendered. That dentist can also "balance bill" for any remainder of that service not covered by the plan's fee schedule. For example if a particular service in "your office" is \$500 and the insurance plan only pays \$400 for that service. The insurance company will pay you the \$400 and you can bill the patient for the additional \$100 or you may choose to accept what the insurance company pays as the full payment. That is your choice.


