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

Dear Dr. Kenzik and VFCDA Board,

We at Good Samaritan Health Clinic have known for some time that the dental needs of the poor and uninsured of west Volusia County are great. We are told that almost every night the clinic is open there is at least one call regarding a dental problem.

We are looking at, and very seriously contemplating, opening a free dental clinic for this group of people, which will require the support of the local dental community. We are asking for your assistance in this matter. Would you consider placing the idea before your members to see what level of interest we have? We feel that we must locate at least ten dentists who would be willing to donate their time one night (approximately four hours) per month prior to progressing with our plans.

Our intention is to open the dental clinic as an arm of our Good Samaritan Primary Health Clinic. This clinic has 350 patient charts, and since opening in October 2008, has had 1100 patient visits. We have 18 local providers and 30 nurses, and approximately 35 regular volunteers who staff the clinic 3 nights a week. Our funding is totally from donations from the community.

As members of the Clinic's Board of Directors we are very interested in the dental health of our community. We would appreciate your consideration in this matter. Thank you and God bless you.

SUBJECT:

FDA School Resource Dentist Program

I am writing to ask for your assistance in appointing a school resource dentist in every county in your district. The Florida Dental Association school resource dentist program has been in place since January 2006 when the House of Delegates approved a statewide network of resource dentists to work with Florida's public school system. The idea behind this initiative is to provide appropriate access to dental care and dental health education for school children and to demonstrate the dental profession's commitment to serve the public.

The first order of business for school resource dentists is to contact the superintendent of schools for their county to seek his/her guidance on the most beneficial ways dentists might assist the schools. More specifically, the school resource dentist may ascertain if the school district has identified:

- A dentist who can be contacted by a school nurse for advice in an emergency and who can develop protocols for handling dental problems.
- A dentist to coordinate the provision of dental education and educational materials in schools or at health related events conducted at schools
- 3) A volunteer network for relief of pain in students who cannot find care elsewhere, i.e. private or public.
- 4) A dentist who can work with the school health advisory committee to represent the dental health perspective, and who can provide input into the creation or revision of the school wellness policy.

Once areas of need are identified and approved by the school superintendent, the school resource dentist may work with school health personnel, other interested dentists in the district as well as the Children's Dental Health Month Coordinator, the Project: Dentists Care Coordinator and the Give Kids A Smile Coordinator in his/her dental association to fashion a program tailored to match the areas of needed dental assistance.

Following the initial contact with the school superintendent, the school resource dentist may seek appointment to the district's School Health Advisory Committee (SHAC) to become the representative voice of organized dentistry for school based education and care programs.

Current school resource dentists are listed on the attached form next to the county for which they have been appointed. Please ascertain if they have made the initial contact with the school superintendent for their school district and if they wish to continue in this role during 2008-2009. Please appoint a dentist for each county that does not have a school resource dentist.



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

STATUS REPORT: TOOTH WHITENING

Florida law makes it a felony (unlicensed practice of dentistry) for a non-dentist to provide, or offer to provide, tooth-whitening services. The law allows tooth whitening supplies to be sold directly to consumers and it allows consumers to apply whitening products to their own teeth. But offering to perform, or actually performing, the service for another person is the practice of dentistry, such that only a Florida-licensed dentist may lawfully do it.

While the law is clear, enforcement has been slow and the number of bleaching kiosks is rising at an alarming rate. Business-owners may not know that a dental license is required if they place the products in, or take an impression of, a consumer's mouth. Yet ignorance of the law is no excuse. Prosecutors may be reluctant to pursue felony charges if they believe—incorrectly—that there is no danger to the patient from tooth whitening. Yet they are sworn to uphold the law. Prosecutors may believe that the punishment far exceeds the seriousness of the crime. Yet the public goes unprotected if the rule of law is compromised. Enforcement agencies may be reluctant to divert meager resources to tooth-whitening choosing instead to focus only on "major" crimes. Yet there is money in the budget to prosecute unlicensed activity and it is indeed a felony. Investigators may face considerable challenges because tooth whitening operations are often set up at very temporary, easily relocated, locations where the business owner is not present to be served with process. Yet these challenges are present with all criminal activity, not just unlicensed practice.

The issue has attracted the attention of the Florida Board of Dentistry but the BOD has no authority to prosecute criminal violations and no authority at all over non-licensees. Instead, unlicensed activity is prosecuted by the Florida Department of Health.

Dentists who want to report unlicensed activity should contact the Department of Health, not the Board of Dentistry. The telephone number to report unlicensed activity is 877-HALT-ULA (877-425-8852).
