VOLUSIA/FLAGLER DENTAL ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MINUTES

The Volusia-Flagler County Dental Association Executive Committee convened at the Red Lobster on International Speedway Boulevard on November 8th, 2011 at 5:30pm.

Dr. Lloyd discussed the following items:

- PNC bank has everyone's signatures on file, Dr. Borer to check on transition from Bank of America.
- Treasurer's Report, considering liquidating (3) accounts into (1) interest bearing account. Dr. Borer to ask PNC Bank representative for recommendation. Option for a Visa checkcard came up for discussion, Committee agreed that Treasurer should carry card. Bud Fleuchaus requested an opportunity for Gateway Bank to represent VFDA. Erin to ask for bid.
- Domestic Abuse Council is in need of hygiene kits on monthly basis. 50 bags at \$90 per month. Dr.
 Larkin opted to take the month of January and Dr. Drake for February.
- Dr Robert Brown inquired about funding for Medicare patients receiving physicals for \$90. Fee would go towards physical (pre-op exam) prior to hospital admission for dental treatment. Donation of \$1500, Dr Lloyd made motion to go ahead, Dr. Olson and Dr, Borer second motion carried.
- Dr. Borer declared an idea for a Christmas tree with gifting ornaments that Dr's may take and follow through with gift. Dr. Borer to find a way to make this possible.
- Give Kids a Smile is coming up on February 3rd. Dr. Larkin was able to receive donated supply kits for 12 offices to service 50 patients each. Spoke about contacting Leslie Fehl with Daytona State College for more clinical help. Contact school counselors and Girls and Boys Club for serious candidates.
- Committee agreed that the press should be more involved, such as Mark Johnson with News-Journal, for all charity functions and events.
- Dentist Day on the Hill will be February 1st from 8am to 1pm with a briefing the day before at 5:30pm.
 Dr. Olson to arrange the meetings with our representatives. Dr. Morejon has the details from past
 Dental Days. Be sure to bring your business cards.
- Staff Appreciation meeting is on March 6th. Erin to contact Hawaiian Inn for Luau dinner details and quote.
- Discussed the voting on Holly Hill Fluoridation that just took place.
- Discussed the idea of changing venue from the Oceanside Country Club for the Installation Banquet and also the date. Discussed changing from end of year, May, to the beginning in August and consolidating party with New Member Mixer. Open to add a regular meeting with a speaker to fill in for April and May.

The Executive Committee meeting was adjourned at 7:24pm.

At the shelter, we provide respite shelter, emergency housing or temporary lodgings for women, children and men as they try to cope with the violence in their lives. Typically people who seek refuge in the shelter have no other place to turn, so remembering to bring their toothbrush or floss is not of paramount importance. In Volusia County during the last 11 months, the shelter has admitted 177 different adults and 119 different children. These numbers do not reflect those individuals or families who have returned to the shelter during those 11 months. The numbers translate to 5,798 heads in beds at the shelter. These numbers are for our shelter alone in Volusia County. They are staggering.

Your contribution is worthwhile and appreciated. We are grateful, and we know the recipients are appreciative too.

"Ridge Preservation for Esthetics, Prosthetics and Implant Placement"

Seminar Presented by Dr. Jon B. Suzuki Professor, Temple University, Philadelphia, PA

Each year in the US, millions of teeth are extracted due to conditions such as caries, trauma and advanced periodontal disease. Extraction site grafting and ridge preservation procedures offer significant advantages to the patient and the dental practice, but many dentists still aren't taking advantage of the benefits these procedures offer to their patients.

Tooth extraction without concomitant socket grafting results in osseous deformities of the alveolar ridge, such as reduced height and width. This makes subsequent management of esthetics, prosthetics and implant placement very challenging. Socket grafting using bone grafts significantly reduces bone loss, maintains ridge dimensions and enhances esthetics and function.

This seminar will provide an understanding of site development principles and bone grafting protocols leading to an optimal foundation for esthetics, prosthetics and implant success.



University of Central Florida Withdraws Dental College Proposal


